CONCERT INFORMATION

The children have been practising devotedly for this exciting event and will be performing at **The Bruce Mason Centre** on **Monday 6th November**. The rehearsal and the performance are on the same day.

Rehearsals

We will be travelling by **bus** to the **Bruce Mason Centre** on **Monday 6**th **November** for a rehearsal.

- Children must be at the school by 8:30 AM, at the latest.
- Transport departs at 8:45 AM.
- The rehearsal; Arrive at 9.00am for a 9.30am start.
- Children need to bring bottled water and snacks for morning tea.
- The children will be offstage by 12:30pm, and will return to school where classes will resume for the rest of the day.

What time does the evening performance start?

- The evening performance starts at 7:30pm and finishes by 9:30pm.
- All students need to be backstage by 6:45pm.
- We will start leading the students onstage around 7:10pm.

What should children wear on performance night?

Children are to wear bright-coloured clothing, the more colourful the better!

No jackets or jerseys are to be worn onstage, as it can get very warm performing under the stage lights.

Who do I contact should my child be late?

Please contact the music teacher to discuss this.

When is intermission, and what will happen?

Intermission is at 8:20pm for 20 minutes. During this time we will take the choir backstage for a short break. We ask all choir trainers to join us backstage during the break. No parents or family are permitted backstage.

How do parents collect their children?

Our MC will explain the procedure for collecting your child at the conclusion of the show. Children will stay with the teachers until they are reunited with their Parents. Parents will be asked to collect their children from inside the venue.

Who do I contact if my child has misplaced any personal items at the venue?

Please contact venue management directly.

What is the cost of ticket?

Ticket prices vary depending on the venue. We try to keep the ticket price as low as we can, to allow as many families as possible to see their children perform. We really appreciate you purchasing a concert ticket as it helps cover the cost of staging this wonderful event. It's important to note that the ticket cost doesn't go towards World Vision's development.
